
3. Follow the steps to set up a username and password:




- 4. Confirm the account in your email.

- i) Edit your profile by filling in the content




ii) select an icon for your page and upload it




iii) You can access your account settings at any time by clicking on the "settings" menu item at the top right of your screen. This will allow you to access your account password, email and more.



iv) The tools menu allows you to add elements to your page, but before you do that, it is best to set up your page with the various plugins available. See mine below:




By clicking on the "Edit Page" link at the top of your personal page, you can add in any plugin that you may want. So I have included my twitter feed, a group feed, friends, chat and more. To add plugins, all that needs to be done is to drag and drop the plugins into the section of the page you wish to utilize them.





- Each plugin you install in your page can be adjusted by using the "edit" button at the top right of each box.


v) Once your page is set up, you are able to access the tools menu to set up additional elements, such as blog posts, pages, links and more:



Elgg also enables direct messages to be sent, simply by clicking on the envelop beside the "Search Community" box at the top right:



You can also put in your existing tools, like twitter:



This allows you to post your blogs, put in live feeds from twitter and other services, as well as collect all your PLE tools in one networked, social place.
