Highlights

- **Career motivations:** Domestic students were significantly more likely to say that they were preparing to *enter* a chosen career:
 - 69% vs 44% international, while international students were more likely to say they're enrolling to *advance* in a current career (45% vs 24% domestic).
- Plans to pursue graduate or professional studies: Domestic applicants to university were more likely than their international counterparts to indicate they had an interest in pursuing graduate or professional studies in the future:
 - 54% vs 48%



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(Top 2 - Strongly Agree and Agree)



(Top 2 - Very Concerned and Concerned)






How concerned are you with the following issues in your first year at UBC: Being able to achieve a high grade point average (GPA)






To what extent are you satisfied or dissatisfied with the following aspects of your UBC experience:




What is your main plan following graduation? (These 2 options were the top 2 picks for both 2021 and 2022)

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(Top 2 - Strongly Agree and Agree)





To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements: UBC has prepared me for further study after graduation

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




BGS - Have You Undertook Formal Further Education Since Graduation?

v education or training are/were you taking? Interactive Bar Chart of Top 3 Further Education Pursuits by Field of Study




BGS Question: Are you currently employed?



BGS Question: Are you currently working in a program-related job?




BGS - Interactive Bar Chart of Top 3 Job Titles by Field of Study
