## Inference and logical deduction

(Goal: Evaluate the model's ability to infer implied information, make logical deductions, or draw conclusions based on the provided text).

Since 2010 the hospital at Minouche operates under constrained resources and has low capacity of beds for patients. - 3. The patients care at Minouche will be kept free for how long?
- 4. Who is not included in the final decision making at Minouche?
- 5. When will the frustration end?
