Possible Theme:

Intersectionality: Tensions and Risks in Open Scholarship & Education

- Panel session on tensions and risks in open scholarship and education
- Hear voices and communities that are not commonly heard in “open” conversations; explore how open can alienate
- Look at intersectionality of different tensions - e.g.:

- *Indigenous & Traditional Knowledge*: Open may not be respectful of community authority, ownership, norms, knowledge sharing etc; Open movement can be appropriative
 - *Instructor/Adjuncts*: May feel open allows universities/other instructors to appropriate their work, putting their value at risk
 - *Gender/race/sexuality tensions in open communities*: are all people welcome and included
 - *Student-faculty tensions*: affordability conversations around OER may lead resentments around motivation
 - *Accessibility tensions*: Is open accessible for everyone; does open lead to digital redlining
 - *Student tensions*: How do open pedagogies create risks for students; are they supported; what rights over their copyright/privacy do they have
 - *Traditional publishing tensions*: Impacts of open on services like UBC Press, UBC Bookstore
- Explore history of open movement and acknowledge mistakes and failures
