


Figure 1: The 2021 age distribution of the District of Lake Country.¹




Figure 2: The population of the District of Lake Country from 2016-2021.^{1,2}

"The continued reliance on the import of food and food products leaves a community vulnerable and contributes to the compounding problem of food insecurity and safety." 5

Poulsen et al., (2014) - "Growing an Urban Oasis: A Qualitative Study of the Perceived Benefits of Community Gardening in Baltimore, Maryland":⁶

• "Gardening also provides exercise for some of the gardeners, being something 'you can do at your own pace, whatever your age'."⁶




Figure 3: The percentage of 120 surveyed community gardeners in the Greater San Diego area who reported each provided benefit they received from participating in a community garden.⁷

Wieneke, (2017) - "Saving Money While Participating in Urban Agriculture":⁴

 ~\$497 (USD) of grocery savings from 50 ft^2 of community gardening space.⁴




Figure 4: The percentage of 42 families who participated in a community garden in rural Oregon that listed food security as a concern before and after the gardening season.⁸




Location Matters!!

- The closer community gardens are to residents, the more likely they are to participate.^{9,10}
- Short walking distances are critical for participation.9

Table 1: The method and time of travel for 124 community gardeners surveyed in Cleveland, Ohio. 9,10



Community Gardens as a Solution: Why are More Needed?

- Only one functioning community garden in Lake Country.
- Easy to access only for residents living in Woodsdale.
- Only 40 plots available to rent annually.¹¹

Why Put Community Gardens in City Parks?

- Provides long-term security.^{12,13}
- Underused or unused space often available. 12
- Greater access water and to electricity.
- Could help meet the municipality's Parks and Recreation Goals.²

- Ensure the continued growth and sustainability of the recreation field. 15.11.5


Figure 5: The Parks and Recreation goals set out by the District of Lake Country in its Official Community Plan.²






Examples of Other Communities with Gardens in Their Parks Stanley Park (City of Vancouver)










Why Put a Community Garden in Apex Park?







• Highly dense neighbourhood + Several multi-unit residences.

Why Put a Community Garden in Swalwell Park?











• Close to HS Grenda and George Elliot schools.

- May bring more business to Lake Country Museum and Archives.


- Adequate parking available.





Conclusion:


- Community gardens can simply, yet effectively help meet the demands of Lake Country's ageing, growing, and increasingly urbanized population.
