## **PUBLISHING & COLLECTIONS**

### **OPEN ACCESS COLLECTIONS TEAM**

The <u>Open Access Collections Team</u> reviews new acquisitions and renewals for open access materials in consultation with subject matter experts and makes recommendations to the Associate University Librarian, Collections.

### OPEN ACCESS PUBLISHER DISCOUNTS

The Open Access Collections Team also facilitates <u>article processing charge discounts</u> through institutional memberships and license agreements.

#### FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES IN OPEN ACCESS AND SCHOLARLY PUBLISHING

The SCCO has continued to administer the <u>UBC Open Access Fund</u> which assists UBC faculty members who wish to publish in Open Access books and journals and who are required to pay associated fees. The <u>Scholarly</u> <u>Publications Fund</u> is available to subsidize other costs of publication such as publisher subventions, indexing, image clearances, etc. These funds are available for all SSHRC-aligned research.



#### **OPEN PUBLISHING PROGRAM**

<u>UBC Library's Open Publishing Program</u> is an open access journal and text service to help UBC faculty, researchers, instructors, students, and staff develop open access publications for scholarship and instruction. UBC Library's Scholarly Communications & Copyright Office (SCCO) is the home of copyright, scholarly communications, open publishing, and open education services and support. The SCCO is part of the Digital Initiatives portfolio, and reports to the Head, Digital Programs and Services.

### SYLLABUS SERVICE AND LOCR

Library Online Course Reserves (LOCR) is a system that allows instructors to easily add articles, books, web links, and media resources to an online resource list for their course. With the Syllabus Service, instructors can submit their syllabi or reading list to our permissions team, either through LOCR or reading list at syllabus.service@ubc.ca, so that they can vet the materials and make them available for student access in a copyright compliant manner.



# **OPEN EDUCATION SUPPORTS**

The SCCO provides in-depth services for open educational resource development, including identifying resources, consulting on open licensure, support using publishing platforms (e.g. Pressbooks, Open Journal Systems) and sharing open educational resources in repositories. Working closely with the <u>Centre for Teaching, Learning and</u> <u>Technology</u>, the SCCO supports open pedagogy in courses where learners become contributors to knowledge by actively creating open, public and re-usable resources for public audiences.

#### **UBC OER COLLECTIONS**

The <u>UBC OER Collection</u> showcases UBC OER content in a searchable interface to support both UBC faculty and the general community in incorporating open educational resources and practices into their curriculum. UBC Library also maintains a <u>catalogue of open texts</u> created by faculty and students at UBC using Pressbooks.

#### **UBCV OER FUND**

The UBCV OER Fund aims to support access to learning materials through the adoption, adaptation, development, and integration of open educational resources. In collaboration with the CTLT, the SCCO provides OER Fund dedicated <u>support and consultation</u> <u>services</u>. See Funded Projects.
