

### **UBCCARD AND PAYFORPRINT**



QUESTION: Where/How can I load my UBCcard?


**ANSWER:** One (1) of three (3) options

- Via PayforPrint "ADD MONEY" Option
  - VISA Debit Cards DO NOT work
- Via Cash/Coin Machine Outside Heritage Core
- At a UBC Food Services Location (Last Resort)
  - Example: White Spot and Tim Hortons

**QUESTION**: Why do I have \$439.00 on my PayForPrint Account?

ANSWER: PayforPrint is part of a pooled set of funds that include "Flex Dollars" that can

be used at UBC Food Services Locations





### LIBRARY CARDS




QUESTION: How can I get a library card? Can I borrow books and other materials? ANSWER:

- UBC/UBCO Undergraduate/Graduate Students: UBCcard serves as library card
  - ONLY currently registered students can borrow materials + access e-Resources remotely
  - Apply at Carding Office in Bookstore
- UBC Alumni: A-Card application at the Alumni Centre or Online
  - Activate via ONLINE Application Form OR in-person at Koerner Library or UBC Okanagan
  - Basic borrowing privileges (2-week loans, renewable), access to online resources via library workstations, and study spaces
  - Some restrictions due to licensing agreements but remote access to online resources (EBSCO) accessible via Alumni Portal







### LIBRARY CARDS



QUESTION: How can I get a library card? Can I borrow books and other materials?

#### **ANSWER:**

- Community Users: Community Borrower Card application at Koerner Library Circulation
  - Must present one-piece of government-issued, photo ID
  - Ranges from \$40-\$120
  - Maximum number of loan items is 50



QUESTION: What if I forget my UBCcard but need to borrow books or other reference materials for my coursework? And the bookstore is closed, on no.

- Borrow materials with a friend's UBCcard OR
- Students can apply for a temporary library card at Circulation (ie. by filling out the blue slip). A notation will be made on their account; future applications will be blocked and student will need to apply for NEW UBCcard. Max ONCE per term.

### **Writing Consultations**

The Centre for Writing and Scholarly Communication supports a diverse community of writers at UBC, at various levels of proficiency, across many types of undergraduate and graduate writing situations: academic, creative, professional, and technical.

Consider booking a one-on-one appointment with a peer writing consultant to support your writing projects.



**QUESTION** (*via phone*): Something came up last minute, can I cancel my Writing Appointment OR can you let John Doe/Jane Doe know I won't be able to make it?

**ANSWER:** Refer student to contact Miles Bruce at 7-1603 OR if cancel appointment online is beyond 12-hours (ie. appointment cancellation changed to a 12-hour window).<sup>1</sup>

# **CWSC APPOINTMENTS**



QUESTION: What can I expect at the CWSC?

#### **ANSWER:**

- Conversation-driven writing consultation (30 mins) for academic, creative, professional, AND technical writing
- Informed by evidence-based, pedagogical approaches: Rhetorical Genre Theory and Writing in the Disciplines
- Bring draft of assignment or other writing and/or description and rubric
- They will NOT simply edit or proofread

QUESTION: *It's Friday.* My term paper is due on Tuesday and all the appointment slots are full. Is there any way I can get some feedback on my paper?

- WriteAway online service offered to post-secondary institutions in BC (undergraduates ONLY)
- Submit and receive feedback within 48 hours

QUESTION: What is Rare Books? Where can I access it?

- 1st floor of the Irving K. Barber Learning Centre
- Closed-stack (not open to general public) area housing unique, rare noncirculating materials for research purposes
- Researchers MUST complete online registration form to apply for Rare Books/Special Collections/University Archives prior to/ during first visit
  - Affiliated users UBC Card
  - Unaffiliated RBSC Community Card
  - Two pieces of identification when consulting materials



# THE CHUNG COLLECTION



QUESTION: What is it? And where can I find it?

- Housed within Rare Books and Special Collections
- Donated by Wallace and Madeline Chung
- Unique collection of 25,000+ documents, photographs, posters, and other artifacts capturing their family's history and the Chinese-Canadian experience
  - Open to Public for self-guided tours
  - To research Chung Collection materials, must apply for Rare Books Patron Card


