



**Considerations:**

- Learning Environment:* It expands the learning environment beyond the UBC community
- Time:* The assignment needs to be scaffold over time in the course depending on the assignment type.
- High Visibility:* Wikipedia is highly publicly visible and editable.
- Group Work:* It is a good place to start when you are creating a group work learning environment
- Flexibility:* It has more flexibility on how you want to format your wiki course or assignment
- Protected:* UBC Wiki is publicly visible, but only editable by users with CWL.
