Dr. Armstrong is a historical ecologist and archaeologist specializing in ancient human land-use in the Pacific Northwest. She is a settler scholar and Assistant Professor in Indigenous Studies at Simon Fraser University, and director of the Historical-Ecological Research Lab. Dr. Grenz has a B.Sc. in Agroecology and a PhD in Integrated Studies in Land and Food Systems from UBC. Dr. Grenz is a proud Nlaka'pamux woman of mixed ancestry whose family comes from the Lytton First Nation. She is Assistant Professor at LFS and Forestry at UBC, and director of the Indigenous Ecology Lab. Dr. Cornelis is pedologist and biogeochemist, studying the role of soil processes on element mobility and fates in terrestrial ecosystems. He is a settler scholar (from Belgium by birth) and Assistant Professor in Soil Science at UBC, and director of the SoilRes3 Lab.
