Conference Alerts

Conference Alerts is a website that gathers alerts from conference organizers and academics. These groups upload information about conferences to a searchable database that is available freely on the Internet. You can look through the list of events by subject, search for alerts and subscribe to the website to have alerts sent directly to your email.

This guide will show you how to find conferences in your subject area using Conference Alerts.

4. If you select a conference topic, you will be brought to a page with conference tagged with that topic.

5. If you select a title of a conference, it will provide you with additional information about the conference including the date, location, contact information, proposal deadlines, and website if available.

6. To have emails sent directly to you about upcoming conferences in your areas of interest, select the "Subscribe" link on the homepage (<http://www.conferencealerts.com/>). You will need to enter an email where you want the alerts to be sent. You will then be brought to a screen that requests you enter information to specify which alerts you want sent.

The form will request your area of interest by keyword and details about the institution you are affiliated.
