To understand the population dynamics of pet rabbits in BC SPCA shelters in the province

Background:

Over the past few years, the BC SPCA has seen a decline in the overall number of animals entering our shelters. However, at the same time, our intake of small animals has been trending upwards. Of these, rabbits are one of the most common species we receive, making up on average a third of total small animal intake. The BC SPCA would like to better understand the flow of rabbits through our shelters from intake to adoption, and how this has changed over time. This will enable us to identify touchpoints for future interventions to ensure optimal rabbit welfare.

Responsibilities:

This position reports to the Manager, Companion Animal Welfare Science & Policy. The practicum involves:

- Pulling various internal data reports spanning a ten-year period
- Performing basic analyses (descriptive statistics) of the data using Excel
- Mapping the data using Google
- Producing a report summarizing the findings, together with a literature review and referenced discussion
- Giving a short (virtual) presentation on the results

What is not reflected in BC SPCA data, however, is the situation facing rabbits outside of our shelter system. The BC SPCA would like to better understand how many rabbits are out there, where they are coming from and how they are changing hands. This will enable us to identify touchpoints for future interventions to safeguard rabbit welfare.

Responsibilities:

This position reports to the Manager, Companion Animal Welfare Science & Policy. The practicum involves:

- Extracting relevant data from a Word document of online classified ads collected
- Organizing the data into an Excel spreadsheet
- Performing basic analyses (descriptive statistics) of the data
- Producing a report summarizing the findings, together with a literature review and referenced discussion
- Giving a short (virtual) presentation on the results
