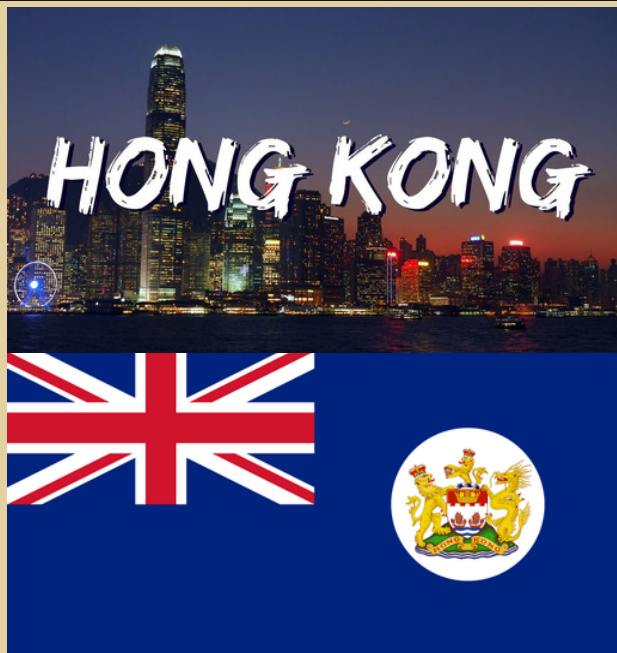


MIGRATION TO HONG KONG FROM MAINLAND CHINA RESULTING IN SOCIAL AND CULTURAL CONFLICTS

- "one country two systems"
- Aging population
- Access to better resources
